

## **How to recycle / dispose of use and empty Gas Cartridges**

Most local authorities now accept empty disposable Gas Cartridges as well as Aerosols in household recycling bins. Please check with your local authority if you are unsure.

The general advice on Aerosols is as follows;

General aerosols including disposable Gas Cartridges can be recycled in the household recycling bin.

Aerosols with orange hazard symbols (e.g. insecticides, oven cleaners, paints and automotive sprays) are not accepted in the recycling bin, these should be put in the general waste bin.

Due to health and safety reasons they must be empty, please remove loose plastic lids and place in your general waste bin. Do not pierce or squash them. Under no circumstances should Gas Cartridges or Aerosols be thrown onto fires.

Before recycling large quantities, contact your local authority.

### Aerosol Cans



#### Kerbside collection

Empty aerosol cans can be recycled along with other tins and cans in your kerbside recycling collection. Please do not include those marked with a skull and cross bones or black cross on an orange background. Do not pierce or squash aerosols and remove loose plastic lids.



#### Household waste bin

Aerosols marked with a skull and cross bones or black cross on an orange background are not accepted for recycling and should be placed in your household waste bin for disposal.
